Entry Requirements

Students must achieve a grade 4 or above in either GCSE English or GCSE Mathematics to be considered for Sixth Form entry. Students will be supported in resitting one of these options if suitable when they progress into Year 12. Students must then meet the individual entrance criteria for each subject they are applying for. Details of these subject specific entry requirements can be found on our website along with detailed information about what each course has to offer.





Enrichment

Today's universities and employers seek well rounded individuals who have explored a range of experiences to develop their skills and character. To this end Waseley Hills offers an extensive range of extra curricular and enrichment opportunities for students to add to their package in a way that suits them.

Students are encouraged to participate in a range of opportunities that build skills and provide valuable lessons for life. All students are required to choose one enrichment option to complete alongside their three subject options. Some students choose to participate in more than one opportunity if their work load allows. In addition, students are expected to complete relevant and valuable work experience in Year 12, typically for a week towards the end of the year, in order to prepare them for working life.

Our end of year mock examinations in Year 12 and our Year 13 entrance criteria also ensure that students remain on a positive journey throughout their time in the Sixth Form.

Application Process

We are looking forward to welcoming students and parents to our Open Evening on Thursday 26th October 2023 5 -7pm. The Head of Sixth Form Welcome will commence at 5pm in the main school hall and there will then be an opportunity to participate in specialist subject seminars and speak to subject staff about the fantastic courses we have on offer.

STEP ONE:

Following on from our Open Evening students are to complete an application form online (link on website) and submit it no later than Friday 24th November 2023.

STEP TWO:

Attend your allocated interview either in person (current WHH students) or on TEAMS (external applicants). Interviews will take place shortly after the Christmas break.

STEP THREE:

During your interview, confirm your preferred choices, enrichment package and explore opportunities for student leadership. If successful you should then await confirmation of your offer. Please note all offers of subject packages will not be fully confirmed until results day and all offers are subject to change.
